A combination of access to an independent careers adviser coupled with specialist onsite support helps us to ensure that our pupils all have realistic plans in place to take their first step towards employment on leaving our school. Our mission statement states that we care for young people and their families – providing them with opportunities to learn and flourish. We pride ourselves on our high expectations of what our young people can achieve, academically, socially and emotionally, and extend that support outwards to ensure their families can flourish too. The curriculum is created to re-integrate students who face barriers to school attendance or those with extreme anxieties. This is the true strength of our curriculum here at Arbour Academy, meeting as it does the needs of those young people and their families by empowering them to embrace education once again - allowing it to enrich their lives and positively impact upon their future beyond our walls.				
Implementation KS4	Learners at KS4 join us at various times of the year and whilst the majority of these learners complete their KS4 education with us some remain with us for a short period of time before returning to their mainstream setting or further specialist provision. Learners have the opportunity to leave with a number of both GCSE and vocational qualifications. Our curriculum model focuses on closing any previous attainment gaps through baseline and regular assessment and personalised 1:1 interventions. The curriculum is delivered in a nurturing, caring and sensory based environment in which learners can access their learning without the pressures of a larger school setting. Staff at Arbour Academy are appropriately trained with individual members of the team having undertaken qualifications such as Elkan, ASD training and Mental Health First Aid.

Implementation KS3	In KS3, the students follow a bespoke curriculum based on reintegrating them into school and establishing 'readiness' for education. The scheme of work covers the subjects in the national curriculum through engaging and practical activities that re-ignite an interest and confidence in school. Our KS3 vision is to re-engage disengaged learners in education and to foster a love for learning. Through the teaching of discreet core subjects and assessment, gaps are identified as learners access the KS3 core curriculum. In addition to this, bespoke educational experiences and inclusion in the academy's Big Theme Days offers learners the opportunity to study Humanities, Technologies, the Arts and languages through highly engaging projects which encompass Cultural Capital. Teaching is tailored and scaffolded to each individual cohort and their needs. The KS3 curriculum provides opportunities for learners to develop foundation skills and knowledge but also to give learners the tools required to access the demands of the KS4 curriculum.
